



Volunteers Wanted!

The Town of Conway owns two forested properties: **The Fournier Property** near the Grammar School and **The Town Farm Property** off Cricket Hill Road.

One stated objective of the Stewardship Plans developed to guide the care for these properties is removing invasive species which have become numerous in some areas on both properties. Asiatic bittersweet, honeysuckle, barberry and multiflora rose are some of the most commonly found perennial invasive species. They threaten healthy native plant communities which offer important ecological benefits such as sustaining biological richness, native plant diversity and forest resilience.

The Forest and Trails Committee is monitoring and removing invasive species and we are asking interested members of the public to join us in these efforts.
