## TAX CLASSIFICATION HEARING

John O'Rourke called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. in the Town Hall Office, Lee Whitcomb and Russell French present for the Assessors and John O'Rourke and Philip Kantor present for the Selectmen (this being a joint meeting of the two boards, posted locally in Conway and on Wednesday in The Recorder legal ads).

• On a motion from Whitcomb to waive reading the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by French, both the Select Board and Board of Assessors voted in favor unanimously.

Whitcomb stated that the purpose of this meeting is a final review of the taxable values, as approved by the Dept. of Revenue. O'Rourke asked why we had a significantly higher value in new growth; Whitcomb and French replied that a great deal of personal property was found in this summer's re-inspection of the town, as well as some outbuilding constructions, in addition to the utility personal property growth.

Whitcomb said that this had a positive impact on our levy limit, as FY18's new growth was \$22,297, compared to FY2019's of \$134,040. This helped to set a proposed tax rate of \$18.65 for FY2019, an increase of only 0.08% from FY2018's rate of \$18.50.

• On a motion from O'Rourke to sign the final Classification Tax Allocation, with a Residential Factor of 1, seconded by Kantor, both the Select Board and Board of Assessors voted in favor unanimously.

Whitcomb asked for a motion from the selectmen to appoint her to sign the DOR's electronic signature requirement in the Gateway Tax Recap on their behalf.

• On a motion for O'Rourke to so appoint Whitcomb, seconded by Kantor, the Select Board voted unanimously in favor.

At 5:07 p.m., on a motion from O'Rourke to adjourn, seconded by French, both the Select Board and Board of Assessors voted in favor unanimously.
