Minutes

May 28, 2019

• On a motion from O'Rourke to approve the minutes of May 28, 2019 as amended, seconded by Armstrong, the vote was unanimous in favor.

Meetings Attended by Select Board Members

Kantor attended multiple contract negotiations in attempt to wrap up teacher negotiations. Armstrong had a number of ConCom meetings re: site visits, including at South River where the Open Space Committee has received a grant to do some more work on invasive species. The State is concerned about this issue also and has funds to work on mitigating invasive species in Conway. Armstrong also had a meeting with FCAT re: finalizing franchise agreement; he met with the other three towns in the district, but nothing has been done to pursue the agreements of those towns. This needs to be ironed out before Conway can know what needs to be done going forward. O'Rourke had a MMA Personnel and Fair Labor Policy Committee meeting; some of the municipalities have severe personnel issues. On Saturday O'Rourke attended the annual Selectmen's Leadership Conference of MMIA; open meeting law and public records laws were discussed, as well as finance and budgeting, regionalization and shared services, and the role of selectboards and how they should cooperate with each other and their committees. Kantor said the topic of regionalization is making the rounds again; he was on the committee that looked at K-12 regionalization, and none of the four district towns can afford to regionalize without legislative action. The FRCOG is a model that other towns look to, said O'Rourke.

New Business

Highway Department

Declare as surplus/authorize to scrap various pieces of old equipment.

Sweet was here to talk about scrapping the old equipment that has been lying around near the Grammar School. The list of equipment was given to Mary McClintock. The equipment has been there for a long time. There are 12 old plows, among other things. McClintock wants to know how Highway Department equipment gets managed. This area has been an attractive nuisance. Does the Town get any money from selling the old equipment? Sweet will investigate that. Armstrong asked about the piece of equipment in South River meadow; that isn't being scrapped.

• On a motion from O'Rourke to declare these items of equipment are surplus and have Sweet scrap them, seconded by Armstrong, the vote was unanimous in favor.

Proposal for new road by sheep barn to approach salt shed

Sweet is concerned that, when the new owner is putting in his new driveway that comes out near sheep barn, trucks coming out of the salt shed and the new owner's cars would be in danger of colliding. Sweet wants to move the road toward the east and the old school, about 30 feet. Sweet had the surveyor out and they located the pins. There was some objection to putting the road nearer to the old schoolhouse. Kantor objects to changing the esthetics, wants to have

Historical Society people participate so they have buy-in to the proposal. McClintock would also like there to be a site visit with others who have been involved to see if there are any creative solutions other than moving the road. Muriel Antes, Howard Boyden, Historical Commission, Historical Society and Grammar School should be involved, said Kantor and McClintock. It could be making the old schoolhouse more accessible to the community if parking spaces are added. Kantor wants a letter to be sent so those who were involved in moving the schoolhouse can have input into this decision. Hutcheson was asked to coordinate a meeting with stakeholders and Highway Department; McClintock wants to be involved and also suggested that Ruth Parnall be added to the list.

Highway Facility Committee: sign contracts with designer for storage building & maintenance facility

The Select Board reviewed the Vreeland contract that Sweet presented for the designer's work. Town Counsel has looked at it and said it was fine. Sweet said the Town will own the plans when they're completed.

• On a motion from O'Rourke to approve the contracts with designer (Vreeland) for design of the equipment storage building, seconded by Armstrong, the vote was unanimous in favor.

Personnel Committee: proposal to allow part-time staff pro-rated sick and vacation days

Personnel Committee recommends this revision which aids the purpose of staff retention, said Hutcheson. He worked with Jan Warner to come up with appropriate compensation for part-time workers. The policy would affect 15 people. Kantor doesn't approve of the policy because it doesn't specify a probationary period. Hutcheson replied that this is earned leave and Conway does have a probationary period. Kantor asked if the Town obligated to buy back unused sick time. Hutcheson said people are only allowed to carry one year of earned time off; this has been the policy since Hutcheson came on. Benefits are specified in the Personnel Policy; this revised policy is just making pro-rated benefits applicable to part-time employees.

• On a motion from O'Rourke to approve the proposal to allow part-time staff pro-rated sick and vacation days, seconded by Armstrong, Kantor abstained.

Committees

As you can tell from the appointments, Lisa has been doing a great job of contacting everyone up for reappointment, finding out whether they're interested, and organizing the appointments into one-year appointments for ad hoc committees.

Departments

I understand that there is a critical need for more EMTs, especially people who can show up during the day. I've put a notice on the web site and hope to generate some interest.

After conferring with the Personnel Committee, I plan to initiate periodic staff meetings. Part of this will be the required annual harassment training (I hope through MIIA and its Employee Assistance Program), part of it will be similar trainings, and part of it will be regular updates to enhance communications.

I'll be meeting with Bob Armstrong soon to make a plan for the electricity aggregation survey. If anyone has any further thoughts, please let either of us know. One item we may want to consider is whether we want to offer a "green" plan that includes electricity from burning wood, as that has been controversial in the past. I hope we can be in communication with other towns about that before making a decision so that we can retain as much bulk buying power as possible.

Our application to FEMA for a grant to assist in the stabilization of the slope from Delabarre Ave. to the river is in its final phase; we've gotten feedback from FEMA and are tweaking the application.

I'm managing to get the two computers procured, with Roy's help, which were approved under the MEMA Emergency Management Planning Grant for FY 2019. We should have everything in order by the end of the fiscal year.

I anticipate needing a short meeting with the Finance Committee for at least one item related to end-of-year finances; I mis-placed the funds for Ginny in the operating account, and it should have been in the salary account. The approval would be post-dated to May of 2020, ensuring she could get paid and avoiding a meeting then. I'm sure Laurie will be looking to her for assistance during the primaries and in preparation for Town Meeting.

Other

I will mention, in case anyone has missed the sign in the triangle in front of the Library, that Mike Haley will be presenting Irish Cannon Ball Croquet as a benefit for the Conway Sportsman's Club scholarship, on June 15, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the ball field.

Select Board Comments

A Town resident has notified Kantor that the sound isn't working on the FCAT recording of Town Meeting. Armstrong mentioned that the reason they're going to be talking about the burning of wood is the state is in the process of changing the rules allowing woodburning to qualify for subsidies for energy certificates. Armstrong is concerned about the effect this change could have on aggregation. Wood burning is dirtier than oil and isn't renewable according to the intent of the law, said Armstrong. The State is changing the rules without any legislative input. The Green Energy Alliance is staunchly opposed to this change, said O'Rourke.
