# April 10th, 2024 Town Administrator Update:

## Grants

We had an MVP planning meeting, continuing discussions on how the program is to be structured. GZA expressed liability concerns about doing work on residential property, since their contract is with the town and not the individual residents. Therefore the group intends to expand the educational portion of the grant, including community ambassadors and other experts who will hold workshops and be of technical assistance to residents wishing to make any of the changes recommended in the stormwater management handbook which will be sent to every household.

**Highway** We had a zoom meeting with many DOT officials as they reviewed their checklists for the Bardwells Ferry Bridge. It was good to hear that DOT is both planning to hurry the project along as quickly as possible, and also make other repairs as necessary while the bridge is still closed, rather than closing it a second time.

I picked up the OWL, laptop, tripod and 25 ipads from Jennifer Remillard at the South County Senior Center. ## **Sustainability**

The committee has submitted their warrant article for the study on streetlights in Conway, and will be working on a Green Communities grant this fall to help with streetlights as well.

Phil, Kendall Clark and I met with Tim Fortier to discuss moving his parents' memorial bench. It was moved successfully today, and later this week Andrew Smith will be taking down a few of the trees in Veterans' Memorial Park.
