Through Mass Save programs, there are a few avenues to replace damaged heating systems with airsource heat pumps. MassCEC has a detailed web resource, <u>Clean Energy Lives Here</u>, that residents can use to learn about heat pumps and how they could be implemented in their homes. This page also covers other technologies and efficiency improvements that might be possible depending on the resident's situation.

If residents are low income, Mass Save could potentially cover most or all of the costs of air-source heat pumps in some situations. More information is available through the LEAN program at <a href="https://masslean.org/">https://masslean.org/</a>.

If they are not low-income, they could utilize the Mass Save whole home heat pump program where they could get \$10,000 per system. This would probably cover just a portion of their cost for it, but they could couple it with a 0% heat loan of up to a \$50,000 loan for 7 years. This could take a month or two to get through (getting quotes, financing, installing), but they could likely still do it before fall sets in.
